**NOTICE OF SPECIAL MEETING OF THE  
TOWN OF SUPERIOR TOWN COUNCIL**

Pursuant to A.R.S. Section 38-431.02, notice is hereby given to the Superior Town Council and to the general public, that a Special Meeting of the Superior Town Council will be held on Thursday, July 13, 2017, at 6:00 p.m. in the Superior Town Hall Auditorium, 199 N. Lobb Ave., Superior, Pinal County, Arizona. The agenda for this meeting is as follows:

1. **CALL TO ORDER**  
Mayor called special session to order at 6:00 pm
2. **ROLL CALL**  
Mayor called for roll call and all councilmember were present.
3. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**  
Mayor led everyone in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance
4. **NEW BUSINESS**
  - A. **Court Fees and Procedures by Judge Bravo**  
Judge Bravo presented his proposal on the fees that will be assessed. Town Manager stated that these fees will not be enforced once the property is cleaned the citation is cancelled. Mr. Aguilar asked how are the residents being notified are they going to be notified in the sewer bills? Mayor, we have let these issues just ride and now we are going to enforce the penalties. Several minutes discussion regarding the fees and the amount of fees, how they will be assessed, and possibly putting an announcement in the local paper and perhaps billing.
  - B. **Court Consolidation Update by Judge Bravo**  
Judge Bravo stated that Pinal County's Board of Supervisors are thinking about reducing the number of justice of the peace precincts. Currently, Pinal has eight precincts. Judge Bravo provided everyone with a map of the possible changes and the different precincts they are thinking about combining. They are not sure about closing the Courthouse in Superior but they are looking at the finances and what it would cost to make the improvements to the Kearny Courthouse. Brief discussion followed. Mayor directed Officer Britton to please give council a update so that they can see and also answer questions from the public and they will be able to see the progress.
  - C. **Code Policies and Approach by Officer Britton and Chief Neuss**  
Officer Britton presented the code enforcement procedures/Mission Statement to everyone. Discussion regarding how to get in touch with Officer Britton since he was getting over whelmed with phone calls. Discussion regarding the RV's parked in front of homes and abounded vehicles. Chief Neuss addressed this issues by telling everyone that they have come up a grid of the Town and they are doing one grid at a time and those issues are going to be delta with.

**D. Administrative Citation Ordinance by Todd Pryor**

A zoning officer will be able to hear a case since Judge Bravo is not sure where he will be but he will be moving around. The Zoning Ordinance does have a section where this is allowed. He would hear the case in house and the advantage to that is we could keep some of the revenue that comes in from a hearing officer being in house. Mr. Pryor added a copy of the Ordinance section for the council to study during the break. Mayor asked for the councilmembers to take the time and look at this over their break so when they get back in September they will be prepared to make some changes or come up with a plan.
